A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Primary and Secondary Education – Health and Safety**
3 **(Sugar-Free Schools Act)**

4 FOR the purpose of requiring certain county boards of education to develop a certain plan
5 on or before a certain date for reducing students' total sugar intake per school meal
6 based on certain recommendations; requiring certain county boards to convene a
7 certain workgroup to assist with the development of a certain plan; providing for the
8 membership of a certain workgroup; requiring the workgroup to make certain
9 recommendations; requiring a certain workgroup to hold a certain number of public
10 hearings and provide a certain opportunity for public testimony; and generally
11 relating to the Sugar-Free Schools Act.

17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
18 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

19 **Article – Education**

20 **7-440.**

21 **(A) ON OR BEFORE AUGUST 1, 2018, EACH COUNTY BOARD SHALL DEVELOP**
22 **A PLAN FOR REDUCING STUDENTS' TOTAL SUGAR INTAKE PER SCHOOL MEAL BASED**
23 **ON RECOMMENDATIONS FROM:**

EXPLANATION: CAPITALS INDICATE MATTER ADDED TO EXISTING LAW.

(1) THE AMERICAN HEART ASSOCIATION; AND

(2) THE WORKGROUP ESTABLISHED UNDER SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION.

(B) (1) EACH COUNTY BOARD SHALL CONVENE A WORKGROUP TO:

(I) STUDY THE BEST PRACTICES OF OTHER JURISDICTIONS REGARDING METHODS OF LOWERING STUDENTS' TOTAL SUGAR INTAKE PER SCHOOL MEAL;

(II) CONSIDER WHETHER THE RESULTS OF THE BEST PRACTICES STUDY WOULD BE APPROPRIATE TO IMPLEMENT IN THE LOCAL SCHOOL SYSTEM; AND

(III) MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE COUNTY BOARD BASED ON:

1. THE RESULTS OF THE BEST PRACTICES STUDY;

2. WORKGROUP DISCUSSIONS AND DELIBERATIONS;

AND

3. PUBLIC TESTIMONY RECEIVED AT THE WORKGROUP'S PUBLIC HEARINGS.

(2) (I) THE WORKGROUP SHALL INCLUDE PARENTS, STUDENTS, TEACHERS, SCHOOL ADMINISTRATORS, MEDICAL PROFESSIONALS, AND NONPROFIT ORGANIZATIONS.

(II) A MEMBER OF THE WORKGROUP MUST BE A RESIDENT OF THE COUNTY IN WHICH THE COUNTY BOARD IS LOCATED.

(3) THE WORKGROUP SHALL HOLD AT LEAST TWO PUBLIC HEARINGS AND PROVIDE AN OPPORTUNITY FOR PUBLIC TESTIMONY AT EACH MEETING.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2017.
