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## Human Trafficking Victims - Establishment of Workgroup

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Workgroup to Study Single-Point Entry for Services and Criminal Immunity for Victims of Human Trafficking; providing for the purpose, 4 5 composition, chair, and staffing of the Workgroup; prohibiting a member of the 6 Workgroup from receiving certain compensation, but authorizing the reimbursement 7 of certain expenses; requiring the Workgroup to study and make recommendations 8 regarding certain matters; requiring the Workgroup to submit preliminary reports 9 on its findings and recommendations to the Governor and the General Assembly on or before certain dates; requiring the Workgroup to submit a final report on its 10 11 findings and recommendations to the Governor and the General Assembly on or 12 before a certain date; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to resources for human trafficking victims. 13
