1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Baltimore City – Alcoholic Beverages – ~~Class B–D–7~~ Licenses – Hours of Sale**

3 FOR the purpose of specifying certain hours of sale for a holder of a Class B–D–7 beer,
4 wine, and liquor license in a certain area of Baltimore City; prohibiting the hours of
5 sale for a license holder in a certain area from beginning before or ending after
6 certain times; prohibiting the hours of sale from being extended under certain
7 conditions; and generally relating to alcoholic beverages licenses in Baltimore City.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article – Alcoholic Beverages

12–102.

This title applies only in Baltimore City.

12–905.

(a) There is a Class B–D–7 beer, wine, and liquor license.

(b) (1) The Board may issue a Class B–D–7 license if the Board determines
that the license is reasonably necessary for the convenience of the public.

(2) In making the determination, the Board shall consider the number of
beer, wine, and liquor outlets in a given area and the number of days the outlets are open,
rather than the nature of the outlets.

(c) The license authorizes the license holder to sell beer, wine, and liquor at retail
at the place described in the license, for on– and off–premises consumption.

(d) (1) [The] **EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS
SUBSECTION, THE** license holder may sell beer, wine, and liquor during the hours and
days set out under § 12–2004(c) of this title.

(2) **THE HOURS OF SALE FOR A LICENSE HOLDER IN AN AREA
BOUNDED BY LIBERTY HEIGHTS AVENUE, NORTHERN PARKWAY, DRUID PARK
DRIVE, AND WABASH AVENUE ARE FROM 9 A.M. TO 9 P.M.**

(e) The Board shall adopt regulations to determine the manner of operation of a
licensed premises.

(f) The annual license fee is \$1,320.

**(C) FOR A LICENSE HOLDER IN AN AREA BOUNDED BY LIBERTY HEIGHTS
AVENUE, NORTHERN PARKWAY, DRUID PARK DRIVE, AND WABASH AVENUE, THE
HOURS OF SALE:**

(1) MAY NOT BEGIN BEFORE 9 A.M. OR END AFTER 9 P.M.; AND

1 **(2)** MAY NOT BE EXTENDED IF THEY BEGIN LATER THAN 9 A.M. OR END
2 BEFORE 9 P.M.

3 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July
4 1, 2017.
