<p>The City of Bowie is located in eastern Prince George's County, near the border with Anne Arundel County. With a population of approximately 56,000, it is the fifth largest municipality in the State of Maryland. The City consists of approximately 18-square miles and its approximately 400 employees provide a full range of services to those who live, work or own a business here. Bowie has a council-manager form of government. The City Council is the governing body of the City, elected by, and responsible to the voters for the operation of the City. The Council has oversight function and general responsibility for municipal affairs through budgeting and setting policy. The Council appoints and directs the City Manager, who manages day-to-day operations of the City government.</p>

The project will add a fulltime, LIVE, Emergency Operations Center. It would be equipped with technology and equipment that will allow multiple users to communicate with the City's new Communications Center, monitor real time situations to include traffic cameras, surveillance systems, video conferencing, WebEOC and other interfaces.
