<b>10. Description and Purpose of Organization</b> (Limit length to visible area)		
<p>The Temple Hills Swim Club (THSC) has been an asset to the community for 55 years. It provides a safe/enjoyable place for families, individuals &amp; their guests to enjoy outdoor recreation &amp; to relax/mingle. THSC has a racially/ethnically diverse membership. The club is managed/operated/maintained by its members who are assessed dues to maintain/operate the 25-meter length pool with diving area and associated facilities. Military members, first responders &amp; their families get membership discounts. THSC sponsors a swim team that gives children an opportunity to swim competitively. THSC sponsors open houses, hosts many daycamps &amp; offers swim lessons. It is the site of many family-style parties (birthdays, graduations, etc) with the public welcome as member guests. THSC has participated in the Strive 2 Tri Program &amp; program graduates have served as guards &amp; pool operators.</p>		

**11. Description and Purpose of Project** (Limit length to visible area)

The Temple Hills Swim Club Board of Directors is seeking funds to complete renovation of the 55- year-old swimming pool facility. With the requested 2022 funds our immediate priorities are to install holding tanks to temporarily contain pool water backwash, replace sand in filters/refurbish filter tanks, repair/replace non-functional underwater pool lights/upgrade associated electrical wiring and electrical panel, resurface pool deck, install parking lot lights for member safety, repair leak/re-plaster non-functional baby/wade pool/replace old filtering system, and upgrade bathrooms to make them ADA complaint. No new construction is planned with the funds. The renovations will not change the pool size.

<b>28. Comments</b>	
<p>The Temple Hills Swim Club needs the state grant of \$300,000 to complete the upgrade of the swim club facility. The Club is 55 years old and had suffered years of neglect and deterioration due to a lack of funding for capital improvement projects. The money raised each year from membership dues, club activities and additional fund raisers are used to support the normal operation and maintenance of the pool. Our baby pool and underwater pool lights have been non-functional for many years. Our pool water filtration system has recently started to fail, allowing sand to accumulate at the bottom of the pool and experiencing leaks from the filter tanks in the pump room. PG County inspectors recently cited us for backwash seepage onto the pool deck which is considered a source of possible contamination and is a potential health concern. For the safety of our members and their guests, we also want to install lighting in the parking area, have our deck resurfaced to eliminate uneven areas that are a trip hazard and refurbish our bathrooms to replace rusty toilet and shower stalls. Additionally, we would like the facilities to become ADA complaint to accommodate persons with disabilities. The Club has acquired estimates for each of these proposed projects and has down selected companies to carry out the proposed work. The State grant would cover the materials and labor required to complete these projects.</p>
