14 15 16	(b) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, if a child care center for school age children is operated before and after school hours in a building which is in use as a public or private school, the school age child care center:
17 18	(1) Shall meet local fire, health, and zoning codes required of school buildings; and
19 20 21	(2) May not be required to meet any additional regulations relative to the physical plant beyond those imposed by the county or the local board of education with respect to that building.
