10. Description and Purpose of Organization (Limit length to visible area)					
The Frederick Police Department (FPD) is a technologically innovative and progressive police agency, committed to ensuring Frederick Citys exceptional quality of life. 11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

Design and construct a solar canopy array overtop of the existing surface parking lot at the new Frederick Police Department Headquarters. The solar canopy project is part of the larger project to provide a new home for FPD. The proposed canopy system will provide approximately 300,000 kWh/year of renewable energy. This project will help offset the carbon impact of operating the facility. Furthermore, it will reduce the urban heat island effect and protect police vehicles from the weather thereby extending the life expectancy of the equipment. Additionally, five parking spaces will be equipped with EV charging stations as part of the project. This will support the future conversion of FPD vehicles to EV.
