BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – Criminal Law Section 3–902 Annotated Code of Maryland (2021 Replacement Volume and 2024 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND. That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article - Criminal Law 3-902.(a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.
